

Now if you don't know who the Bix Mix Boys are, well you just missed out seeing one of Edmonton's oldest & finest Bluegrass bands. The Boys came well prepared & served up a platter of some good old tunes and some originals that had Canadian content. The group of 5 hit the stage and just started right into their set. Their vocals were strong & the instruments tight.

Fronted by banjo wiz Darcy Whiteside, Darcy shared the spotlight with all the members of the band, who each had their own respective job to do. And do it, they did. People weren't really dancing in the aisles, but toes were tapping. Good luck Boys, and thanks for a job well done.

The next act hailing from the great State of Colorado, was none other than Spring Creek.

Now these guys must have been drinking coffee with steroids in it. I don't know where else they got the energy from, but it was contagious. The mando picker couldn't stand still. HE WAS THAT INTO IT!!!! And could he play. His STRONG tremolo (right hand work) was incredible...enough to make any mandolin student & lover of the instrument drool all over. Grass Clippings

History of the Name Bluegrass

Although the influences that formed bluegrass music have a long history in European and African traditional music, the term "bluegrass" was first coined in the 1940s. The moniker originated when musician Bill Monroe named his band Bill Monroe and the Blue Grass Boys after their native Kentucky, known as the Bluegrass State. As their sound gained popularity, the name stuck and their style became widely known as bluegrass. Bluegrass music has always had a dedicated "grassroots" following, the style occasionally makes a splash in pop culture, particularly through bluegrass songs featured in successful movies. In 1967, the film "Bonnie and Clyde" featured Earl Scruggs's "Foggy Mountain Breakdown," first bringing the bluegrass sound to a wider audience. In the 1972 film "Deliverance," the song "Dueling Banjos" was featured prominently. More recently, the Bluegrass song "Man of Constant Sorrow" from the 2000 film "Oh Brother, Where Art Thou" became a hit, pushing the soundtrack to multi-platinum status, and winning a Grammy award for "Best Country Collaboration."
